For the 2018 Showing Season, we will be awarding points as listed below. Each horse/rider/handler combination will accumulate points throughout the season to qualify for the Howe Grand Finale at the Anniversary Charity Show.

Combinations achieving 50-75 points will qualify for the Bronze finale, taking part on the day of the Anniversary show to receive a speciality bronze rosette.

The winning Bronze combination will go forward to the Silver finale.

Combinations achieving 75-100 points will qualify for the Silver finale, taking part on the day of the Anniversary show to receive a speciality silver rosette.

The winning Silver combination will go forward to the Gold finale.

Combinations achieving 100 or more points will qualify for the Gold finale, taking part on the day of the Anniversary show to receive a speciality gold rosette. **The winner of the Gold finale, selected by our panel of judges, will be**

Howe's Supreme of the Year, winning themselves £500 and a further £500 for their chosen charity. Howe's Reserve Supreme of the Year will win themselves £250 and a further £250 for their chosen charity.

Caledonian Showing Championships

The Caledonian Showing Championships are now well established in the showing calendar and will once again give 2018 competitors the opportunity to compete at a top level Championship Final in Scotland.

Evening Performances, loads of bling and razzmatazz everything an end of season Championship should have!

This year's show will be held at

Highfield @ Howe, near Ladybank, Fife on 13/14 October 2018

This Show is a qualifier and every horse & pony placed 1st and 2nd in all Inhand, Ridden Showing classes (not fun classes) & Working Hunter/Pony classes will qualify to compete in any appropriate class at the Finals. Qualification will be from placings, no qualification cards will be awarded in the ring, and no qualification can go down the line. Qualification is for the Horse & Pony except for Adult/Young Handler classes, where the Handler qualifies.

All qualified horses and ponies will be listed on the Caledonian Showing Show's website www.caledonianchampionships.webs.com where you will also find a regularly updated list of qualifying shows as well as a wealth of other information.

CHAPS (UK)

"This show is affiliated to The Coloured Horse & Pony Society (UK).

Affiliation No:18223

Both owner and the rider/exhibitor need not be a member of CHAPS (UK) nor must the horse or pony be registered with CHAPS (UK) to compete. However in order to Qualify both Owner and Rider/Exhibitor need to be a current showing member and present their valid Qualifier card IN THE RING for signing by the judge.

Members to apply in writing to CHAPS (UK) for appropriate qualifier card.

The CHAPS (UK) Championship Show will be held on 30th August-1st September 2018. Shows held on or after the Postal Entry closing date of Championship Show will count as 2019 qualifiers. The following classes are CHAPS (UK) Qualifiers [].

For full rulings and information on competition/qualification, please refer to the CHAPS (UK) Members' Handbook; or visit www.chapsuk.com for rulings. Only Skewbalds/Piebalds may compete these classes.

All stallions, 4 years old and over entering these classes must be graded with CHAPS (UK). All stallions must wear Stallion ID Discs in the ring without exception.

NPS Scotland Rules 2018

1. Ponies may only qualify once for each NPS Scotland Competition Final. Ponies that take a second qualifier for the same section will not be allowed to enter the final.
2. All Mountain & Moorland Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective stud book. Part bred, X registered ponies, ponies in the appendices of their main stud book and Eriskays are not eligible.
3. Qualification in the M. & M In Hand Section may go to 3rd in the Championship.
All others may go to no lower than 4th place.
4. A Judge is not obliged to award an NPS Scotland Finals qualification if he/she feels that the pony is not of a sufficient standard
5. Closing Dates for Entries: Competitors qualifying at Shows held before Monday 4th June 2018 must send their qualifying cards and entries in by Thursday 28th June 2018. Shows after 5th June 2018 adhere to a closing date of 1st August 2018 and Late Entries will NOT be accepted. Competitors that qualify at late shows after the 1st August 2018 are required to email the secretary and send in the qualifying cards within 3 days of the show.
6. Cavasson nosebands are the only nosebands permitted in flat ridden classes.
7. Entry for the Finals can only be made by sending the official card duly signed by the Judge at the time of qualifying with your entry form.
8. The OWNER must be or become a member of NPS Scotland before entering the Finals.
9. All ridden ponies must be shown off the lead rein except in the specified Lead Rein Qualifier Class.
10. In Mountain and Moorland classes riders of stallions must be 12 years old or over when riding small breeds (Shetland, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Welsh A & B). For large breeds (Highland, Fell, Dales, Connemara, New Forest, Welsh C & D) riders of stallions must be 14 years old or over.
11. A child must have attained their 12th birthday as of the 1st January in the current year to either strip or lunge pony at a NPS show, except for stallions where age will same as in the Rule Book to ride a stallion.
12. Handlers of stallions or colts must be 14 years old or over.
13. Handlers of ponies in In Hand classes aged 14 years and under must wear a correctly secured skull caps/riding hat that meets the current standards.
14. The Final will take place at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials on Friday 24th August 2018.

Veteran Horse Society – QUALIFIER 2018.

This is a qualifier for the Veteran Horse Society Supreme Final:

SCOTTISH VETERAN HORSE OF THE YEAR 2018 - Kindly Sponsored by Allen & Page.

Each VHS affiliation in Scotland now holds a PRE-QUAL Supreme Final qualification. Open to members and non-members. However, only Members may go forward to the Championship of the day. VHS Membership to be applied for no later than 1 week prior to this show, to avoid disappointment.

VHS Scottish Supreme (Pre-Judging) Final qualification. ONLY MEMBERS placed 1st to 2nd in each age category will go to the Veteran Championship of the Day. In all classes - if competitors placed 1st or 2nd are not Members qualification will be given to 3rd & 4th providing they are Members. Qualification will not go lower than 4th place. If the Champion or Reserve has qualified then 2nd or 3rd reserve may take qualification.

- All competitors and grooms must adhere to VHS 2018 Rule Book in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification.
- Champions and Reserve Both In-hand and Ridden must have their showing card signed by the judge in the ring as proof of qualification. This will qualify through the pre-judging of the Supreme. Competitors to present their Show Card to the judge for qualification. Should the Championship be combined the top 2 ridden and top 2 in-hand go forward.

Mountain & Moorland. The highest placed Mountain and Moorland in each class will receive entry to the pre-judging of the Mountain & Moorland Supreme Final. Providing they are Members. This may be carried down to 4th place. To be registered with a Breed Society and hold a current Breed Society passport. Young Rider Championship qualification. A Young Rider qualification will be awarded to the young rider of the Judge's choice, entitling them to enter the Young Rider Championship Prior to the Supreme Final This award is given at the Judge's discretion. Non Members to receive an orange card.

Highfield at Howe Policy on Classes Clashing

All competitors please note that we will do our best to avoid classes clashing, however in the event that a competitor has two classes running at the same time:

******* It is the competitor's responsibility to make the office and the ring stewards aware of the classes that clash.

******* Every effort will be made to allow the competitor to compete in both classes.

******* If one class is close to finishing, the second class will wait for the competitor.

******* If both classes are to run at the same time, the class due to start first will commence and the competitor will be allowed to do their individual show first and leave the arena to go to the second class with no consequence to the placings in either class.

******* As we will put every effort to allow competitors to take part in all classes entered, please be aware that no refunds can be offered if a competitor chooses to withdraw from one class in the event of two classes clashing.

Each VHS affiliation in Scotland now holds a PRE-QUAL Supreme Final qualification

There is no 2nd round each show has the same status.

Open to members and non-members. However, **only Members may go forward to the VHS Championship of the day.**

VHS Scottish Supreme (Pre-Judging) Final qualification. ONLY MEMBERS placed 1st to 2nd in each age category will go to the Veteran Championship of the Day. In all classes - if competitors' placed 1st or 2nd are not Members qualification will be given to 3rd & 4th providing they are Members. Qualification will not go lower than 4th place.

All competitors and grooms must adhere to VHS Rules in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification.

Champions and Reserve Both In-hand and Ridden must have their showing card signed by the judge in the ring as proof of qualification. This will qualify through the pre-judging of the Supreme. A Blue card entry will be given by the judge to complete and return to VHS Head Office, with the relevant entry fee.

Young Rider Championship qualification. A Young Rider rosette and qualification will be awarded to the young rider of the Judge's choice, entitling them to enter the Young Rider Championship Prior to the Supreme Final This award is given at the Judge's discretion. Non Members to receive an orange card.

The Champion & Res. Champion in all Mixed, pure-bred M & M, or Breed Championships will qualify for the Final which will take place at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials on Friday 24th August 2018. **Qualification may go to 3rd in the Championship (ie 1st Reserve Champion)**

NPS SCOTLAND/NFU MUTUAL OPEN IN-HAND RIDING PONY/HUNTER PONY CHAMPIONSHIP

Class 33 - In hand Hunter Pony - Youngstock, stallions, mares and geldings not to exceed 153 cms at maturity

Class 34 - In hand Riding Pony - Youngstock, stallions, mares and geldings, not to exceed 148 cms at maturity.

The highest placed pony, in each open in-hand Riding Pony or Hunter Pony Class (foal classes excluded) not already qualified, will qualify for the Final which will take place at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials on Friday 24th August 2018. **Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place**

NPS SCOTLAND/ KILGRASTON SCHOOL M&M LEAD REIN CHAMPIONSHIP

Class 35 - Lead Rein pony, mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, not exceeding 122cms registered in the Breed Society Stud Book of Shetland, Dartmoor, Exmoor, New Forest, Welsh Section A or B. Riders must be 3yrs on the day of the Show and must not have reached their 9th birthday by 1 January in the current year.

The owner does not have to be an NPS Scotland member for the pony to enter this competition, but the owner must become a member to enter the final.

Ponies will not be stripped.

Ponies must be shown in a snaffle bit.

Ponies may not be ridden side saddle.
Handles on saddles are permitted.

The 2 highest placed ponies in the Lead Rein Class not already qualified will go forward to the final which will take place at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials on Friday 24th August 2018. **Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place**

NPS SCOTLAND/ KILGRASTON SCHOOL M&M FIRST RIDDEN CHAMPIONSHIP

Class 36 - First Ridden pony, mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, not exceeding 128cms registered in the Breed Society Stud Book of Shetland, Dartmoor, Exmoor, New Forest, Welsh Section A or B. Riders not to have reached their 12th birthday by 1 January in the current year.

The owner does not have to be an NPS Scotland member for the pony to enter this competition but the owner must become a member to enter the final.

Ponies must not be cantered except in their individual show.

Ponies will not be stripped.

Ponies may not be ridden side saddle.

Ponies may be shown in any suitable bridle.

The 2 highest placed ponies in the First ridden class not already qualified will go forward to the final which will take place at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials on Friday 24th August 2018. **Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place**

NPS SCOTLAND/KILMANNAN STUD NOVICE RIDDEN MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND CHAMPIONSHIP

Class 37 – Novice Ridden stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years and over - small breeds (Exmoor, Dartmoor, Shetland, Welsh Section A or B) registered. Snaffle bridle only.

Class 38 - Novice Ridden stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years and over - large breeds (Connemara, New Forest, Dale, Fell, Welsh Section C or D) registered. Snaffle bridle only.

A pony is not eligible to compete if, before 1st January in the current year, it has done any of the following:

- i. Won an open NPS affiliated mixed M&M Ridden class
- ii. Qualified for Horse of the Year Show, Olympia or RIHS Open M&M Ridden classes
- iii. Qualified for the M&M Novice or Intermediate Ridden final at the NPS Summer Championship show (N.B. Ponies can compete as novices in this competition for two consecutive years provided they do not submit an entry to the final in the first year).
- iv. If a pony qualifies for Horse of the Year Show, Olympia or RIHS in its second year it is immediately de-noviced and cannot compete in the Kilmannan or Picton Final.

Rider any age, except stallions (see rules).

Ponies must be shown in a snaffle bit.

A minimum of 6 ponies must be stripped in qualifying rounds. All ponies will be stripped in the Final.

The 2 highest placed ponies, not already qualified, in each class will qualify for the Final which will take place at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials on Friday 24th August 2018. Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place. This can be either mixed M. & M. or Breed Classes.

NPS SCOTLAND/BAILEYS HORSE FEEDS OPEN RIDDEN MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND CHAMPIONSHIP.

Class 39 – Open Ridden - Highland Fell, Dale, New Forest, Connemara or Welsh Pony Section C or D, 4 years old or over, registered.

Class 40 - Open Ridden - Exmoor, Dartmoor or Shetland Pony Welsh Pony, Section A or B, 4 years old or over, registered.

The owner does not have to be an NPS Scotland member for the pony to enter this competition, but the owner must become a member to enter the final.

To be shown in any suitable bridle.

A minimum of 6 ponies must be stripped in qualifying rounds. All ponies must be stripped in the NPS Final.

The 2 highest placed ponies, not already qualified, in each class will qualify for the Final which will take place at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials on Friday 24th August 2018. **Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place.** This can be either mixed M. & M. or Breed Classes

HIGHFIELD AT HOWE WILL DO EVERYTHING POSSIBLE TO ENSURE THE SAFETY OF ALL PEOPLE AND HORSES AT ALL TIMES, HOWEVER ALL PRESENT MUST FOLLOW ALL RULES AND ANY INSTRUCTION GIVEN BY ALL OFFICIALS TO PREVENT INCIDENTS OR ACCIDENTS OCCURING.

1. Highfield at Howe strongly advise all entering to have suitable liability insurance for all they take part in and it is a condition of entry that all entering accept that Highfield at Howe are not responsible for any accident, loss or damage. All entering do so that their own risk.
2. Highfield at Howe reserve the right to change judges, amalgamate classes and change rings if necessary.
3. Objections must be presented to the secretary within thirty minutes of the incident with twenty pounds which will be refunded if objection is upheld. The judges' decision is final.
4. NO MUCKING OUT ONTO CAR PARK. Fifty pound fine will be enforced on anyone caught.
5. Dogs must be on leads and under close control at all times.
6. Although every effort will be made to accommodate all riders/handlers, it is solely the rider/handlers responsibility to be at the correct ring at the correct time. If classes may clash, please make the ring steward aware, however it is at the judges' discretion if late arrivals are allowed to enter the class. The judges' decision is final.

7. In the interests of safety the warm up arena may be restricted to the next class only, all riders to respect others, ride left to left, and be in control at all times.
8. Any horse or pony considered by an official to be lame or a danger to themselves or others will be asked to retire from the show.
9. If any rider dismounts in a class at an incorrect time, falls off or a handler lets go of a horse it is the judges' decision if they may continue in the class. The judges' decision is final.
10. Refund of entry fees is solely at the discretion of Highfield at Howe.
11. Stabling fees are not refundable.
