For the 2018 Showing Season, we will be awarding points as listed below. Each horse/rider/handler combination will accumulate points throughout the season to qualify for the Howe Grand Finale at the Anniversary Charity Show.

Combinations achieving 50-75 points will qualify for the Bronze finale, taking part on the day of the Anniversary show to receive a speciality bronze rosette. The winning Bronze combination will go forward to the Silver finale.

Combinations achieving 75-100 points will qualify for the Silver finale, taking part on the day of the Anniversary show to receive a speciality silver rosette. The winning Silver combination will go forward to the Gold finale.

Combinations achieving 100 or more points will qualify for the Gold finale, taking part on the day of the Anniversary show to receive a speciality gold rosette. **The winner of the Gold finale, selected by our panel of judges, will be Howe's Supreme of the Year, winning themselves £500 and a further £500 for their chosen charity. Highfield @ Howe, near Ladybank, Fife on 13/14 October 2018

This Show is a qualifier and every horse & pony placed 1st and 2nd in all Inhand, Ridden Showing classes (not fun classes) & Working Hunter/Pony classes will qualify to compete in any appropriate class at the Finals. Qualification will be from placings, no qualification cards will be awarded in the ring, and no qualification can go down the line. Qualification is for the Horse & Pony except for Adult/Young Handler classes, where the Handler qualifies.

All qualified horses and ponies will be listed on the Caledonian Showing Show's website www.caledonianchampionships.webs.com where you will also find a regularly updated list of qualifying shows as well as a wealth of other information.

CHAPS (UK)

"This show is affiliated to The Coloured Horse & Pony Society (UK).

Affiliation No:18222

Both owner and the rider/exhibitor need not be a member of CHAPS (UK) nor must the horse or pony be registered with CHAPS (UK) to compete. However in order to Qualify both Owner and Rider/Exhibitor need to be a current showing member and present their valid Qualifier card IN THE RING for signing by the judge.

Members to apply in writing to CHAPS (UK) for appropriate qualifier card.

The CHAPS (UK) Championship Show will be held on 30th August-1st September 2018. Shows held on or after the Postal Entry closing date of Championship Show will count as 2019 qualifiers.

All stallions, 4 years old and over entering these classes must be graded with CHAPS (UK). All stallions must wear Stallion ID Discs in the ring without exception.

Veteran Horse Society – QUALIFIER 2018.

This is a qualifier for the Veteran Horse Society Supreme Final:

SCOTTISH VETERAN HORSE OF THE YEAR 2018 - Kindly Sponsored by Allen & Page.

Each VHS affiliation in Scotland now holds a PRE-QUAL Supreme Final qualification. Open to members and non-members. However, only Members may go forward to the Championship of the day. VHS Membership to be applied for no later than 1 week prior to this show, to avoid disappointment.

VHS Scottish Supreme (Pre-Judging) Final qualification. ONLY MEMBERS placed 1st to 2nd in each age category will go to the Veteran Championship of the Day. In all classes - if competitors placed 1st or 2nd are not Members qualification will be given to 3rd & 4th providing they are Members. Qualification will not go lower than 4th place. If the Champion or Reserve has qualified then 2nd or 3rd reserve may take qualification.

- All competitors and grooms must adhere to VHS 2018 Rule Book in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification.
- Champions and Reserve Both In-hand and Ridden must have their showing card signed by the judge in the ring as proof of qualification. This will qualify through the pre-judging of the Supreme. Competitors to present their Show Card to the judge for qualification. Should the Championship be combined the top 2 ridden and top 2 in-hand go forward.

Mountain & Moorland. The highest placed Mountain and Moorland in each class will receive entry to the pre-judging of the Mountain & Moorland Supreme Final. Providing they are Members. This may be carried down to 4th place. To be registered with a Breed Society and hold a current Breed Society passport. Young Rider Championship qualification. A Young Rider qualification will be awarded to the young rider of the Judge's choice, entitling them to enter the Young Rider Championship Prior to the Supreme Final This award is given at the Judge's discretion. Non Members to receive an orange card.

THE HORSE & COUNTRY RACEHORSES SERIES QUALIFIER – OPEN TO MEMBERS AND NON MEMBERS

The Horse & Country Racehorses (HCR) series is open to Thoroughbreds who have raced, trained or been bred to race. Racing injuries will be ignored providing the horse is sound. Riders must be 14 years plus, ridden horses must be 4 years plus and veterans are 12 years plus. Judges will not ride and you will not be asked to gallop as a ride but may be asked to gallop in your individual show. To qualify for the championships at the Grand Slam at Ingliston 2018, the handler/rider and horse must be registered with HCR, you must carry your cards in the ring for signing and be placed 1st---4th (qualifications may be passed down to 6th place). Non---members must send their qualification cards (presented by the judge), fees and register with HCR no later than 14 days after this show and before the closing date for entries for the Grand Slam.

Class 10 - HCR Inhand Ex Racehorse; horses any age and sex, handlers to be 14years and over.

Class 11 - HCR Ridden Ex Racehorse; horses 4 years old and over, any sex, riders 14years and over.

Society of GB rules. Hats must conform to the BRC rulebook.

Qualification: The first three partnerships in each qualifier will qualify for the final even if they did not jump clear. If one of the first three has already qualified, their qualification can be passed down to the fourth placed horse and rider provided they jumped clear. To be eligible for the final, the rider must be a member of a riding club affiliated to BRC.

Final: Blair Castle International Horse Trials

Eligibility: Horses must be 15hh or over, 4 years old and over. Riders must be 18 years old or over. To compete at the final, either the rider or owner of the horse must be a member of the BHS. Course: 8-12 fences approx 3'6", judged in line with Sports Horse GB rules. You can find (download the Show Regulations from the list of Forms).
Qualifying: The first three partnerships will qualify even if they have not jumped clear. If one of these has already qualified, their qualification may be handed down to the fourth placed horse and rider provided they had a clear round in the jumping.

To compete at the FINAL riders must be a **BHS Member** and this must be registered prior to the date of the final.

- * Stable hire payment is **nonrefundable**.
- * Overnight stables will be supplied with shavings. Please clear out dung when vacating the stable leaving clean shavings behind.
- * **THE GATES TO THE CENTRE WILL CLOSE AT 9.30PM. NO ENTRY WILL BE ALLOWED AFTER THIS TIME. PLEASE ENSURE THAT YOU WILL ARRIVE BEFORE THIS TIME.**
- * **THE GATES WILL NOT OPEN IN THE MORNING PRIOR TO A SHOW UNTIL 6.30AM**
- * All stable lights must be out by **10pm**. If anyone wants to check their horses after this time please use a torch so you do not disturb other horses.
- * We ask you to keep all stable blocks clean and tidy.
- * Electric hook ups can be supplied by prior arrangement. Vehicle registration must be given.
- * Extra shavings and hay can also be supplied at additional cost by speaking to a member of staff.
- * Hot shower for washing horses can be arranged by speaking to a member of staff who will advise of cost.
- * Warm up and jumping arenas may be available on evening prior to show. Speak to a member of staff who will advise on cost of hiring.
- * Please take care of tack and valuables as the centre will not take responsibility for any damage or loss.

HIGHFIELD AT HOWE SHOW RULES

- * HIGHFIELD AT HOWE WILL DO EVERYTHING POSSIBLE TO ENSURE THE SAFETY OF ALL PEOPLE AND HORSES AT ALL TIMES, HOWEVER ALL PRESENT MUST FOLLOW ALL RULES AND ANY INTRUCTION GIVEN BY ALL OFFICIALS TO PREVENT INCIDENTS OR ACCIDENTS OCCURING.
- * 1. Highfield at Howe strongly advise all entering to have suitable liability insurance for all they take part in and it is a condition of entry that all entering accept that Highfield at Howe are not responsible for any accident, loss or damage. All entering do so that their own risk.
- * 2. Highfield at Howe reserve the right to change judges, amalgamate classes and change rings if necessary.
- * 3. Objections must be presented to the secretary within thirty minutes of the incident with twenty pounds which will be refunded if objection is upheld. The judges' decision is final.
- * 4. NO MUCKING OUT ONTO CAR PARK. Fifty pound fine will be enforced on anyone caught.
- * 5. Dogs must be on leads and under close control at all times.
- * 6. Although every effort will be made to accommodate all riders/handlers, it is solely the rider/handlers responsibility to be at the correct ring at the correct time. If classes may clash, please make the ring steward aware, however it is at the judges' discretion if late arrivals are allowed to enter the class. The judges' decision is final.
- * 7. In the interests of safety the warm up arena may be restricted to the next class only, all riders to respect others, ride left to left, and be in control at all times.
- * 8. Any horse or pony considered by an official to be lame or a danger to themselves or others will be asked to retire from the show.
- * 9. If any rider dismounts in a class at an incorrect time, falls off or a handler lets go of a horse it is the judges' decision if they may continue in the class. The judges' decision is final.
- * 10. Refund of entry fees is solely at the discretion of Highfield at Howe.
- * 11. Stabling fees are not refundable.
